BOOK CRITIQUE

A. Writing Requirements

- 1. Quote Analysis
 - a. From your reading logs, journal entries, and IR slides select two quotes from the beginning, middle, and end of the book for a total of 6 quotes.
 - b. Each quote must include a paragraph (4-8 sentences) where you explain the significance of the quote. Why is it important to the narrative or argument? How is it related to other parts of the text or to things outside the text?
 - c. Be organized and save your stuff electronically, in a special folder, in case you lose the hard copy.

2. Review

a. You need to write two paragraphs. One of them is a short summary (5-10 sentences) and the other is an analysis. Your analysis could respond to the following questions (or see me about developing your own question/prompt): What was good about the book? What was bad about the book? What did you learn from reading it? As always, use evidence and reasoning to back up your claim.
